#### TITLE IV—ASSISTANCE TO INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION FOR IMPROVEMENT OF PUBLIC AFFAIRS AND ADMINISTRATION PROGRAMS

##### AUTHORIZATION FOR GRANTS

SEC. 401. The Commissioner is authorized to make grants to institutions of higher education to assist them to carry out comprehensive programs, not to exceed five years in duration, to expand or improve the graduate education in public affairs and public administration provided at the institution, including programs designed to renew the professional knowledge of Federal, regional, State, and local governmental officials. Such programs may include the expansion or improvement of graduate instruction in those social sciences which form the basis for effective education programs in public affairs and public administration. Grants under this title may be for projects and activities which are an integral part of such a comprehensive program such as—

- (1) planning for the development or expansion of graduate education in public affairs of public administration,
- (2) increasing and training faculty,
- (3) teaching, research, curriculum development, and other related activities,
- (4) acquisition of additional library resources,
- (5) research on problems of government,
- (6) developing and carrying out short-term intensive courses to renew the professional knowledge of public service employees.

##### GRANTS

SEC. 402. The Commissioner may make a grant under this title to an institution of higher education to assist it to carry out a program which he determines meets the requirements of section 401. No grants under this title shall exceed 75 per centum of the cost of the expenses incurred by the institution in carrying out the program with respect to which the grant was made or continue for more than five years with respect to any one program. Payments under this title may be made in installments, and in advance or by way of reimbursement, with necessary adjustments on account of overpayments or underpayments.

##### PRIORITIES

SEC. 403. The Commissioner shall, in consultation with the Advisory Council on Public Service Education, establish a system of priorities to be used by him in making grants under this title where the funds available are insufficient to permit him to approve all eligible applications.

##### AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS

SEC. 404. For purposes of carrying out this title, there is authorized to be appropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1968, the sum of \$5,000,000; for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1969, the sum of \$10,000,000; for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1970, the sum of \$15,000,000; for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1971, the sum of \$20,000,000, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1972, the sum of \$20,000,000, and for the four succeeding fiscal years such sums as may be necessary to enable institutions of higher education to complete programs begun before July 1, 1972.

#### TITLE V—ADVISORY COUNCIL AND GENERAL PROVISIONS

##### ADVISORY COUNCIL ON PUBLIC SERVICE EDUCATION

SEC. 501. (a) There is hereby established an Advisory Council on Public Service Education which shall consist of the Chairman of the Civil Service Commission, who shall be Chairman, of the Advisory Council, the Commissioner of Education, and ten additional members appointed by the President. Of the ten additional members, one shall be an officer or employee of the Federal Government,
