

DIRECTOR OF EMPLOYMENT SECURITY RESEARCH AND STATISTICS

This is specialized technical and supervisory work which involves the direction of statistical reporting and analysis and research activities in a state-wide employment security program. An employee in this class usually receives general administrative direction from the agency head. Responsibilities include supervising a staff of professional, technical and clerical personnel engaged in the collection, analysis, interpretation and presentation of program data. This work also involves participation in agency program planning and policy development, functional supervision of local office reports, including development of reporting procedures and validation of local office reports, the preparation of administrative analyses of agency activities and the carrying out of basic research studies in the fields of labor market analysis and employment security operations. This class usually requires college graduation, including courses in statistics and economics, considerable professional experience in progressively responsible research and statistical work, usually in the employment security field, including some responsible supervisory duties.
