HEALTH OFFICER

This is the professional entry position in medical work in the public health field. An employee in this class may work with the director of a division in the central office and is responsible for making field investigations of the factors related to the causes of various communicable diseases. The incumbent evaluates facilities available and recommends techniques to be used to prevent or treat such diseases, and may be in charge of a small local health unit or assist a health officer of higher rank in the administration of a larger local unit. This class requires graduation from an accredited medical school, plus one year's internship, and ability to secure a license to practice medicine in the State. One year of graduate study in public health may also be required.
