

DEPUTY STATE DIRECTOR, CIVIL DEFENSE

This is highly responsible administrative work, involving the planning, organizing and directing of the state-wide defense program. The incumbent may be responsible for supervision of one or more specified phases of the civil defense program. Duties include acting for the State Director in his absence. The class usually requires college graduation and considerable administrative and planning experience in a large-scale public, military or industrial organization, or an equivalent combination of education and experience.
