Rosin	Licensing	Restricted to all sources, but liberalized <u>de facto</u> for EEC and Greece. Since restriction restored in January 1964, liberalization date postponed several times, most recently to December 31, 1968.

<u>Valuation and Taxes</u>		
Automobiles (passenger cars)	Annual use tax (vignette). Tax depends on fiscal horsepower and age of car.	Standard U.S. cars fall in highest tax bracket liable to payment in first year of \$200, while European cars generally pay \$30.
Automobiles (passenger cars)	Registration tax. Tax depends on fiscal horsepower of car.	Increase in tax rates, effective January 1, 1968, affected all U.S. cars sold in France, but in effect, exempted all French-manufactured vehicles.
All imports	Border Tax. Normal rate applicable to most industrial products is 20%. For imports, tax is levied on duty-paid c.i.f. value.
