2 trade in the markets of the United States through the regulation of
3 imports of goods in such manner as will enable domestic products
4 and products of foreign origin to share equitably in the future
5 changes in the level of demand in the United States market in
6 accordance with their respective shares of the market during a
7 recent representative period, and thus to contribute to the economic
8 well-being of workers and the stability of their communities in the
9 United States while affording enduring opportunities to foreign nations
10 and their workers to benefit from mutually profitable trade relations
11 with the United States.

12 SEC. 3.(a) Upon application of the representative of any
13 employee organization in a domestic industry, or of any firm,
14 group of firms, or industry organization, or of any farmers'
15 organization, or of any community organization, the Secretary of
16 Commerce, as to manufactured products, the Secretary of
17 Agriculture, as to agricultural commodities and forestry products,
18 and the Secretary of the Interior, as to mineral products and
19 fishery products, shall promptly make an investigation and make
20 a report thereon not later than four months after the application is
21 made, to determine whether any article or group of articles com-
22 prising any significant product category in any line of commerce
23 in the United States is being imported into the United States under
24 such circumstances as to satisfy the criteria specified in Section 2
25 (a)(1), (2), or (3) of this Act.
