I noticed here in the figures that we have from the Department of Commerce that the ratio of imports to production in 1961 was 3.5 percent, and then it was increased up to 1967 to 7.5 percent.

The ratio of imports to consumption went from 3.5 percent in 1961

to 7.3 percent in 1967.

I was wondering, have you any figures about the first quarter of this year, as to increasing or holding, or what?
