Electrical equipment	Safety Regulations	Significant, 1964 imports from U.S. \$261 million. Estimate of increased imports not possible	Legal but not negotiable	Certificate of Canadian Standards Association required for electrical equipment sold and used in Ontario Province. All other provinces will accept, but do not require, CSA approval. Handship primarily on small U.S. manufacturers.
