PROGRAM III: BROADCAST

Statutory authority.—Communications Act of 1934, as amended.

Nature of program and benefits.—The broadcast program, in very general terms, consists of the licensing and regulatory functions of broadcasting and associated auxiliary services. Broadcasting includes two aural services (standard or AM broadcasting and frequency modulation or FM broadcasting) and visual service (television). Within these principal services are found the several related auxiliary services.

The purposes of regulation of radio and television transmissions for reception by the general public is to make available to all people in the United States,
