Communications Act of 1934, as amended.

Nature of program and benefits

The Safety and Special Radio Services embrace the use of radio by ships and aircraft; by rail and motor carriers; by local governments; by amateurs; by industry, manufacturers, public utilities and other business; by individuals; by agencies concerned with police and fire protection; and for national defense
