AWARDS OF OPERATING AUTHORITY

The Federal Aviation Act of 1958 specifies that air carriers, to engage in air transportation within the United States or to and from the United States, require a certificate of public convenience and necessity, or a permit or an exemption from the Civil Aeronautics Board authorizing such air transportation. Air taxi services are covered by exemptions and services by foreign air carriers are covered by foreign air carriers are reversed by the normal activities involved in carrying out this program include:

(1) The processing of applications for air transportation operating authority or modification of authority either by hearing or nonhearing procedures;

(2) The conduct of investigations initiated by the Board involving operating authorities;
