

in the National Archives, it could be the preparation of finding aids; and in records centers, the disposal of records. Of course, in the long run, curtailment of support activities will lead to less efficient performance and higher costs in activities performed on demand.

19. If additional funds were available, what would you do with the new money? In the archival subprogram—encompassing the National Archives, the Presidential Libraries, and the National Historical Publications Commission—the lack of funds has been most obvious. That subprogram has recently been analyzed in depth by GSA and the Bureau of the Budget, and some corrective measures have been taken. Additional specific actions have been planned. Financial circumstances permitting, GSA is hopeful that the President's budget for fiscal year 1970 will include several positive, constructive measures for solving the problem.
