## PROGRAM.—FOREST HIGHWAYS (LIQUIDATION OF CONTRACT AUTHORIZATION)

A. Statutory or administrative authority for the program

The forest highway system, which is approximately 25,600 miles in length, is composed of main and secondary roads within or adjacent to the national forests. It is located in 40 of the 50 States and in Puerto Rico. Approximately 13,100 miles of the system are located in the 12 most westerly States and in South Dakota.

About 12,500 miles are located in 26 Eastern States and in Puerto Rico.

The authority is contained in the Biennial Highway Acts. (Public Law 89-574,

23 U.S.C. 101 et seq.)

Actual and estimated progress of the program over a period of 5 years is B. Output summarized below (dollars in thousands):
