Note: In summary, it is estimated that the total expenditure for additions and improvements to general and long-term hospital and other medical facilities in the District of Columbia through the end of fiscal year 1971 will be approximately \$89,000,000 of which \$4,100,000 will be covered by the existing Medical Facilities Acts and \$36,200,000 would be provided under S. 1228.
