B. SUMMARY

Eight voluntary hospitals and two D.C. Government hospitals have requested a total of \$40,052,000 in grant funds under HR 6526. In addition loans requested by these institutions under HR 6526 total approximately \$40,575,000. Hill-Harris funds required but available only in part, amount to \$4,127,000.
