Dear Congressman Sisk: This will reply to your letter of June 20 and will, I believe, provide additional information to amplify and further clarify my testimony before Subcommittee No. 5 of the House District Committee in respect to H.R. 6526 and S. 1228 on hospital construction.

1. The present estimated cost at D.C. General Hospital of \$73.91 per day docs include the cost of the medical staff. The hospital admits between 23,000 and 30,000 patients per year and sees some 160,000 patients in its outpatient clinics; in addition, approximately 70,000 patients visit the emergency room each year. Approximately 7% of the total cost of patient care at D.C. General Hospital has been reimbursed each year by the patients themselves or through insurance companies through fiscal year 1966. Beginning, however, with fiscal year 1967 with the advent of Medicare, this figure is now rising to approximately 14%. This percentage will increase still further as we begin to implement the Medicaid (Title XIX) Program.

2. The estimated cost per day at Glenn Dale Hospital at the present time is \$30.89. I should hasten to point out that this is not really comparable with the figure at D.C. General Hospital because Glenn Dale Hospital is a chronic disease
