of another government in preference to the interests of 1 the United States; 2 "(13) intentional, unauthorized disclosure to any 3 4 person of classified information; "(14) willful violations or disregard of security 5 regulations, or recurrent and serious, although uninten-6 tional, violations of such regulations or unauthorized dis-7 closures of classified information; 8 "(15) any illness, including any mental condition, 9 of a nature which in the opinion of competent medical 10 authority may cause significant defect in the perform-11 ance, judgment, or reliability of the individual, with 12 due regard to the transient or continued effect of the 13 14 illness; "(16) any criminal, infamous, dishonest, immoral, 15 or notoriously disgraceful conduct, habitual use of in-16 toxicants to excess, drug addiction, or sexual perversion; 17 "(17) any other fact, activity, association, condi-18 tion, or behavior which tends to establish reasonable 19 ground for belief that access by such individual to 20 21 classified information or to any defense facility will not be clearly consistent with the national defense or security 22 23 interests.

"(e) For the purposes of this section, probable cause

shall exist for the characterization under subsection (d) of
