transaction, matter, or thing concerning which he, under 1 compulsion as herein provided, may testify, or produce  $\mathbf{2}$ evidence, documentary or otherwise; but no natural person 3 so testifying shall be exempt from prosecution or punishment for perjury committed in so testifying. Any person who 5 willfully neglects or refuses to appear, or refuses to qualify as a witness, or to testify or produce evidence in obedience to any process duly issued under this section, shall be fined not more than \$500, or imprisoned not more than six 9 months, or both. Upon certification by the President (or 10 his designee) concerning any such neglect, refusal, or failure 11 by any person, to the United States attorney for any judicial 12 district in which such person resides or is found, the United 13 States attorney shall proceed by information for the prosecu-14 tion of such person. The President (or his designee), upon 15 good cause shown, may (1) authorize any party to a per-16 sonal appearance proceeding under subsection (k) of this 17 section to obtain the testimony of any person by deposition 18 upon oral examination or by written interrogations, and (2) 19 appoint any person to obtain such testimony. Any person so 20 appointed shall have the power to administer oaths. 21 "(o) The fees and expenses of witnesses subpensed or 22 called by or on behalf of the applicant shall be borne by 23 the applicant, excepting that the President may, in accord-24
