

Mr. ROBACK. That is under the Access-to-Records Act.

Mr. MORSE. Public Law 87-653.

Mr. ROBACK. All right. That is for purposes of checking the accuracy of the data, but there are other antecedent statutes with regard to access. Thus in a cost-plus contract you have the statutory right of access.

Mr. MORSE. That is right.

SUMMARY OF RATE REDUCTIONS

Mr. ROBACK. I just wanted to understand what the problem was. Will you present us with a summary of your actions which have led to rate reductions?

General KLOCKO. Yes; we will put that in the record.
