DEAR MR. SPOONER: I have reviewed the testimony given by the President of Roadside Business Association, at which time you accompanied him as counsel, and I wish to commend your Association for the forthright and factual manner in which the Roadside Business story was related.

A great service has been rendered to the thousands of people engaged in the Outdoor Advertising Industry, as well as the thousands of land owners who

would be affected.

In 1958 a survey was made by an outstanding member of our International Union of the industry. That report reveals that 152,017 employees were at that time (1958) on a full-time basis and this factor is important. All of these people were employed on "off-premise" locations. There can be no doubt that a great increase in this number has evolved since that date. In any event, I am sure that they are all most grateful for your kind attention to this important matter.

In closing, Paul, may I state that I too testified before the House Subcommittee on Roads and in my years in Washington since 1927 I have never faced or known a Committee of Congress who comprehended and understood the issue as this Subcommittee appeared to understand. I have high hopes that sound judgment and reason will prevail in this matter.
