

Public Assistance Payments Lag Behind the Economy

In the 29 years state the inception of hederal public assistance programs under the 8 year Security Act, to June 1968, asset we payments (in adjusted dollars) per recipient increased 82 percent in the Ald to Families with Dependent Children program, and 116 percent in the Old Age Assistance program. These increases lag far behind the general economy.

Just in the last five years, from 1961 to 1965, personal consumption expenditures increased 32 percent; wages and salaries also increased 32 percent. In this same period, payments per recipient (in adjusted dollars) increased only with 11 percentor both Old Age Assistance and Ald to Families with Dependent Children recipients.
