Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of to acquire, by donation or purchase with donated or appropriated funds, all or where Carl Sandburg lived and worked during the last twenty years of his life, adjacent or related property as the Secretary may deem necessary for establishment of the Carl Sandburg Home National Historic Site.

3EC. 2. The national historic site established pursuant to this Act shall be of the Act of August 25, 1916 (39 Stat. 535), as amended and supplemented (16 461-467).

SEC. 3. There are authorized to be appropriated such sums as may be necessary. to carry out the provisions of this Act.
