The subcommittee met, pursuant to recess, at 10:30 a.m. in room 1310, Longworth House Office Building, Hon. B. F. Sisk (Chairman of the subcommittee) presiding.

Mr. WALKER (presiding). The committee will come to order.

Mr. Sisk has had to go to another committee to testify, and will be back in just a very few minutes. In the meantime, we will conclude the hearings on H.R. 10407 and S. 1864, to regulate the practice of psychology.

At the last hearing the Washington Psychiatric Society requested permission to present certain amendments which they have filed with us and which we would like to have them present, as well as receive any comments that the Psychological Association may have thereto. We requested the District of Columbia Government representatives, Mr. Moyer and Dr. Schultz, to review these prepared amendments also so that their views would be welcome.

At this time if Dr. Schultz and Mr. Moyer will come forward, we would be glad to hear any remarks that you may have.

STATEMENT OF THOMAS F. MOYER, ASSISTANT CORPORATION COUNSEL; ACCOMPANIED BY DR. JOHN D. SCHULTZ, ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR, MENTAL HEALTH AND RETARDATION, DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH—Resumed
