

We are willing to drop Section (A) but we would prefer to see our wording of Section 20(B) retained in place of the psychiatrists' wording.

Mr. SISK. Do you gentlemen feel strongly on that or would you want to compromise on that issue in line with Dr. Cummings' suggestion, elimination of (A) and retention of (B) ?

Dr. LEGAULT. The wording we followed here was at the suggestion of Congressman Whitener. We feel that it is quite adequate. I don't think it is a big argument, however.

Mr. SISK. All right. That is something I think the committee will have to make a determination on.

Gentlemen, I appreciate very much your appearance here. This probably seems a little out of order as a matter of procedure but, frankly, it only indicates the concern of this committee and the hope that out of this we might write some legislation that will improve the situation that we understand everyone agrees does need some improving. I do appreciate the attitude and atmosphere, and recognize the difference of opinion as we have it on committees every day. I do appreciate your kindness in being here.

The hearing is closed. The subcommittee stands adjourned.
