Mr. TEAGUE of Texas. I believe very much in the two-party system. We have to have some Republicans and if we have to have them I am glad to have Mr. Teague of California. Mr. Haley of Florida.

Mr. HALEY. I am Jim Haley of the Seventh Congressional District of Florida and I say to my good friend, Congressman Teague of California, that I agree with the chairman that if we must have Republicans—and I hope we don't have too many of them—we are glad to have Republicans like him.

Mr. Teague of Texas. Jim Haley is chairman of our Hospital Subcommittee and this year one of the main things our committee will do is to take a good hard look at our whole hospital system from the viewpoint of whether we are doing enough on renovation and

kidney machines and that sort of thing in our hospitals.

Mr. Brown of California.

Mr. Brown. I am George Brown of Los Angeles. I want to add my welcome to that of the other members of the committee. Having served the last 6 years on this committee, I have a very high regard for its chairman and members and I assure you I will be doing everything in my power to aid the veterans throughout the United States.

Mr. Teague of Texas. George is chairman of our Education Sub-

committee and he also has a lot of work to do this year.
