Human Relations Commission, and I contacted my lawyer actually. I have about \$400 worth of damages. It cost me about \$300 to get my front fixed, and I had merchandize shot up in the store. I had records in there that were shot through, a stack of records. So it is approximately about \$400 or \$500 for the damages.

So I contacted my lawyer to actually see if he could take the case. He said he would charge me \$250 to go to court, so this has knocked it out.

this hearing for? Everybody seems to think that this didn't happen, that this really didn't happen. But, gentlemen, I have a store there that is shot up. There is a man down there dead, who was the gentlemen that came by my store, with 39 bullets in him. It don't take 39 bullets to kill no man. I don't think anybody can survive 39 bullets.

I would like for you to take a realistic view. What you are going to do is truly up to you. If there is any doubt in anybody's mind here of really what happened or of whether it was the State Troopers, I will tell you one thing: At twelve o'clock the night my store was shot up -my brother lives on the other side of Bergen Street. I stayed to his house until about eleven o'clock, eleventhirty, and I walked across Bergen Street. There was one car on Bergen Street and it belongs to the gentleman next door to me. It was an old station wagon. For the whole block of Bergen Street for six blocks there was one car. and I didn't see one individual there at twelve o'clock at night. Maybe somebody else came on the street after then. but at twelve o'clock there wasn't one car, I am pretty sure that with the State Troopers shooting down the street there wasn't anybody on the street. If they had been there they would have been dead like the other fellow shot taking out the garbage. It isn't a fact that you are trying to say who

It isn't a fact that you are trying to say who actually did it. We know who did it. It is just a matter of: What are you going to do?

  - A Actually happened.

would not believe what happened?

are kidding. The police wouldn't do it." I feel this, too. We are all intelligent people. If I was a governor or whatever, if this did happen -- this is why I tried to contact the head of these individuals. This to me is a stupid thing for a police department to do, a very stupid thing. They talk about the rioters. It is a bad thing. "Lock how Newark locks after the riot." But what do you expect in a town where a person would shoot up a shop? I work everyday for my living.

  I was threatened I called them. They said this is a bad

time. I could understand that. They said, "We need all the men. This is your problem. You get killed if you want to. You got to stay out of sight." This is true. It was more important to hold the town than to actually protect me, but yet still I was threatened and I was threatened by somebody.

Q What do you expect this Commission to do?

A I think this Commission should report to the Governor and the mayor, and I think really there should be I know the Police Department. They are not going to condemn the Police Department and the State Troopers or prosecute anybody. But it isn't a bad thing to give them a tongue lashing and to publicize this thing in the newspaper that these were actually State Troopers that did this and we know it.

I have a friend on Aven Avenue that was in his cleaners. This man had to take his wife and kid from the first floor and go up on the second floor because they were shooting. He lives in back of the cleaner on the first floor.

because the Negro shops were not touched. This is why they were mad.

I expected my shop to be broken into, but I didn't expect it to be broken into by the State Troopers. I figured maybe some of the white people in the area around would get jealous. If they had broken out my shop, I couldn't have been too mad about it because I feel it is a little unfair for one shop to get broken into and not another. But for this to come from the State Troopers and the National Guard, to me I think it is a very dirty thing. You know what this means, don't you? This means it is very corrupt.

Anytime witnesses -- I mean you can see an isolated incident where they would do this or maybe one or two people saw them and they figured these people won't talk, but it is a known fact. It is a known fact this is what happened. I will give them to you.

MR. MEYNER: But did you personally witness any firing of guns by the State Police?

THE WITNESS: No, sir. I can't say. Out of my window at home I can just see the cars going along Bergen Street. This is all I can see
