Dear Judge Serpentelli:

I am writing to express the position of Cranbury Township concerning the appropriate region for Cranbury for fair share allocation purposes.

It is the Township's position that the appropriate region is the Primary Metropolitan Statistical Area developed by the Department of the Census. This area consists of Middlesex, Somerset, Mercer and Hunterdon Counties. This roughly approximates the journey to work region from Cranbury Township and provides a convenient statistical base from which to generate housing information. Its primary advantage is its workability in satisfying the determination of region in Mount Laurel II without the necessity of developing mountains of statistical data for this purpose.

The position of some of the plaintiffs seems to be that Cranbury has been remiss for not undertaking their own independent study of region and developing its own fair share allocation plan. The practical impact of such a study in Cranbury is much more severe than on other municipalities with substantially larger populations. It seems unfair and inefficient to require every municipality, regardless of size, to undertake such extensive studies.
