Dear Mr. Epps:

I am in receipt of your correspondence dated April 6, 1987 in which you indicate your interest in having this office represent you in a mediation effort involving the Township of Cranbury and the Council on Affordable Housing.

After discussing these matters with my Division Director, Mr. Richard Shapiro, and a staff attorney, Ms. Susan Oxford, I have determined that it would be appropriate for us to comply with your request insofar as the Cranbury mediation. While I think that our resources are too limited to do more, I am of the opinion that we can assist you in maintaining a holding pattern until such time as we can get an affirmative response to the appeal of the ruling governing the activities of the Rutgers Clinic. I am hopeful that ultimately they will be able to resume their prior position as your representative.

It is my understanding that the mediation effort will endure for perhaps a month. I do hope that you can understand that we would like to do more, but that our resources at this point are just too overextended to be quite that accommodating.

Ms. Oxford will contact your office to carry out whatever administration is required.
