Dear Roy:

I finally got a hold of Ed Boccher today. He indicated that he had met several times with the developers of the inclusionary sites and scheduled a meeting to meet with Monroe to discuss to potentiality of sites outside the Monroe/Jamesburg border being utilized.

At the meeting with Monroe, the Mayor of Jamesburg showed up and indicated that Jamesburg was withdrawing all of its objections and that the objections previously raised were unauthorized. As of two days ago, Jamesburg's Council allegedly reaffirmed its objections and now objects to the sites as set forth in the housing plan of Monroe.

The mediation period will expire as of Monday, November 3, 1987. Ed indicated he will present to COAH on Monday a recommendation that the matter be transferred to the ALJ. It is my understanding that no action is to be taken at that meeting but it is probable action will follow at the following meeting.

Accordingly, per our last luncheon meeting we must determinewhere we are going with this and if there is any way we can get the matter back to the courts. I would suggest a conference call of all concerned next week.
