
ORDER

It is hereby ORDERED this 13 day of December, 1985, that:

1. Further Trial Court proceedings in regard to the Borough of South Plainfield are hereby stayed pending Supreme Court decision of South Plainfield's appeal of this Court's denial of South Plainfield's motion to transfer;

2. Restraints imposed regarding the Borough of South Plainfield remain in effect.

3. It is further ORDERED that the stay shall remain in effect pending the resolution of the appeal in the within matter now pending before the Supreme Court; provided, however, that plaintiff may make application for a modification of this Order or other appropriate relief based upon any proposed municipal action that might affect the municipality's ability to satisfy its Mount Laurel obligations or upon any other relevant change in circumstances.
