My dear Judge Serpentelli:

This will acknowledge receipt of pleadings filed by the Urban League, Plaintiffs in the above matter, returnable before Your Honor on Tuesday, September 11, 1984, regarding the imposition of restraints against the Municipal Planning Board and other related agencies with respect to a developmental application submitted on behalf of Reidhall Incorporated. As Your Honor may recall, this is the second such application filed by the Plaintiffs, involving the fourth tract of land upon which development is proposed.

As I advised Your Law Clerk this morning, the Township of Piscataway does not intend to appear on the return date of the application. The Township has previously submitted argument

on the earlier application, and reiterates its arguments submitted at that time; other than that, the Township takes no position regarding the grant or denial of the restraints sought.
