This is to certify that we: Dennis A. Garrison,

Carolyn F. Landis, do hereby associate ourselves into a corporation under and by virtue of the provisions of an Act of the
Legislature of the State of New Jersey entitled "The Corporations and Associations Not for Profit Act" (Title 15 of the
Revised Statutes of 1937, NJSA) and the amendments thereto and
supplements thereto, for a lawful purpose other than pecuniary
profit as hereinafter stated; and to that end we do by this
instrument certify that:

SECOND: The purposes for which the conjuration are organized are:

f. To foster, encourage, assist and engage in any kind of work for improving the economic, social, health and educational conditions among members of the biack race, and

g. To give aid to such other minority groups as may be effectively assisted by this organization.

directly or indirectly, either alone or in conjunction or in conjunction with others, to do any and all lawful acts and things and to engage in any and all lawful activities which may be necessary, useful, suitable, desirable, or proper for the furtherance, accomplishment, festering, or attainment off any or all of the pruposes for which the comporation is organized, and to aid or assist other organizations whose activities are such as to further, accomplish, foster or attain any of such purposes. Notwithstanding anything hereis to the contrary, the conjunction shall exercise only such powers as are in furtherance of the exempt purposes of organizations set for the in Section 501 (c) exempt of the internal revenue code and its regulations as the same now exist or as they may be hereafter amended from time to time.

ation shall inure to the benefit of or be distributed to its believe, trustees, officers or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and enjowered to pay reasonable expenses for services rendered and to make paymonts and disbursements in furtherance of the purposes set forth in the above articles hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be carrying or of prejaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign-

ing on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provisions of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not purmitted to
be carried on, (a) by a corporation exempt from Rederal income
tax under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Resemble Code of
1954 (or corresponding provision of any future United States
Internal Revenue Law) or, (b) by a corporation, contributions
to which are deductible under Section 170 (c) (2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 for the corresponding provisions of
any future United States Internal Revenue Law).
