CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION

OF

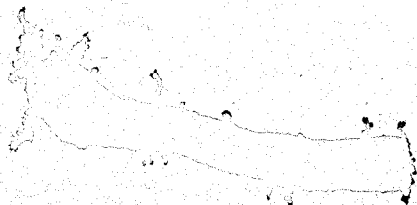
URBAN LEAGUE OF GREATER NEW BRUNSWICK

This is to certify that we: Dennis A. Garrison, Joan K. Hart, Earl Chisom, Earl Venable, Rona Kicklighter and Carolyn F. Landis, do hereby associate ourselves into a corporation under and by virtue of the provisions of an Act of the Legislature of the State of New Jersey entitled "The Corporations and Associations Not for Profit Act" (Title 15 of the Revised Statutes of 1937, NJSA) and the amendments thereto and supplements thereto, for a lawful purpose other than pecuniary profit as hereinafter stated; and to that end we do by this instrument certify that:

FIRST: The name of the corporation shall be Urban League of Greater New Brunswick.

SECOND: The purposes for which the corporation are organized are:

- a. To promote interracial cooperation and harmonious relations between white and black races.
- b. To promote knowledge and understanding of racial problems.
- c. To promote coordination of existing agencies and organizations for improving the industrial, economic, social, health and educational conditions of black people, and to develop other agencies and organizations where necessary.
- d. To make studies of the economic and social conditions among black people.



- e. To encourage a sense of responsibility among black people for improving their own welfare.
- f. To foster, encourage, assist and engage in any kind of work for improving the economic, social, health and educational conditions among members of the black race, and
- g. To give aid to such other minority groups as may be effectively assisted by this organization.

THIRD: The corporation shall have the power, either directly or indirectly, either alone or in conjunction or in cooperation with others, to do any and all lawful acts and things and to engage in any and all lawful activities which may be necessary, useful, suitable, desirable, or proper for the furtherance, accomplishment, fostering, or attainment of any or all of the purposes for which the corporation is organized, and to aid or assist other organizations whose activities are such as to further, accomplish, foster or attain any of such purposes. Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, the corporation shall exercise only such powers as are in furtherance of the exempt purposes of organizations set forth in Section 501 (c) exempt of the internal revenue code and its regulations as the same now exist or as they may be hereafter amended from time to time.

FOURTH: No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of or be distributed to its members, trustees, officers or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable expenses for services rendered and to make payments and disbursements in furtherance of the purposes set forth in the above articles hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign-

ing on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provisions of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on, (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) or, (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170 (c) (2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 for the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

FIFTH: Upon dissolution of the corporation, the Board of Trustees shall, after paying or making provisions for payment of all of the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of all of the assets of the corporation exclusively for the purpose of the corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious or scientific purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), as the Board of Trustees shall determine. Any of such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the appropriate court of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for the purposes of such organization or organizations as said court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

SIXTH: The location of the principal office of this corporation is 167 North Avenue, in the City of Plainfield, County of Union and the name of the agent therein and in charge thereof, upon whom process against the corporation may be served is William Wright, Jr., Esquire.

SEVENTH: The number of trustees of this corporation is six (6).
