PLAINTIFFS' MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT OF THEIR MOTION TO PERFECT THEIR

In order to understand the necessity for this Motion, it is essential to review briefly the procedural history of the appeal in the case at hand. Between August 18 and 20, 1976, eight of the 22 defendants against whom judgment was entered in the Superior Court, Chancery Division, served their notices of appeal from the judgment entered below

on July 9, 1976. Each of these appeals was given a separate number by the Clerk of the Appellate Division. On August 31, 1976, the plaintiffs served their notice of cross-appeal filed against these eight appealing defendants. That cross-appeal bears the number A-4683-75, which had already been assigned to Plainsboro's appeal. On the same day, August 31, 1976, the plaintiffs served their notice of appeal upon the 14 other defendants against whom judgment had been entered on July 9, 1976. This appeal was given No. A-33-76.

During September, 1976, the parties to the appeals and cross-appeals made numerous motions regarding the case. For example, the Township of Woodbridge moved to dismiss the appeal, using Plainsboro's Docket No. A-4683-75. Other defendants also moved to dismiss the appeals taken against them: Helmetta (citing Docket No. A-33-76); Highland Park (citing Docket No. A-4748-75); and Milltown (citing Docket No. A-33-76). Additionally, Cranbury, for itself and seven other defendants, moved for a temporary stay of the judgment below. Even though the appeals were not consolidated at that time, this motion referred to Docket No. A-4685-75. Furthermore, defendant Carteret filed a cross-appeal under Docket No. A-4683-75.

In light of the proliferation of docket numbers and the inevitable confusion that would arise, Deputy Clerk Kiernan, on September 20, sent a notice to all counsel advising them to use Docket No. A-4685-75 instead of Docket No. A-4748-75 for all papers filed in the matter. The notice also requested a motion to consolidate. On October 6, the plaintiffs moved to consolidate all the appeals and cross-appeals arising out of the case below under Docket No. A-4685-75. On November 24, 1976, the Appellate Division granted the motion to consolidate, although it did not expressly indicate which docket number should be used in the future. (Since the plaintiffs had moved to consolidate all appeals and cross-appeals under Docket No. A-4685-75, the Appellate Division consolidation order presumably adopted that suggestion.)

After the order of consolidation, however, the parties and the Office of the Clerk continued to use different numbers on the papers filed in this case. For example, on August 23, 1977, the Clerk's Office used Docket No. A-33-76 when it advised the plaintiffs that their motion for leave to file an overlength brief did not have a certificate of service. In furnishing that certificate to the clerk on August 26, 1977, the plaintiffs cited two docket numbers, A-33-76 and A-4685-75. On or about September 1, 1977, it appears that all counsel and the Clerk's Office began using
