

Please be advised that I am in receipt of a copy of the correspondence to you, dated May 30, 1986, from Thomas Norman, Esq. on behalf of the Old Bridge Township Planning Board.

As the Township Attorney for the Township of Old Bridge, I concur with the decision of the Planning Board to have Carl Hintz, our Planning Consultant, review the draft calculations of the Affordable Housing Council in order to determine its relationship to the settlement in this matter.

Furthermore, on the basis of the information provided by Thomas Norman, Esq., in his letter, I join with his concern as to the viability of the settlement in this matter. As the Township Attorney, I have no objection to meeting with representatives of the developers in this matter to discuss the effect of the wetlands issue upon the settlement.

Finally, on behalf of the Township of Old Bridge, I join with Mr. Norman in stating for the record that the Township of Old Bridge is not waiving any of its rights concerning the re-opening of this matter due to the wetlands issue or due to the significant change in municipal responsibility under the proposed regulations of the Affordable Housing Council.
