Dear Ms. Winkler:

This firm represents Woodhaven Village, Inc. with regard to the above referenced litigation. We are in receipt of copy of letter from Thomas Norman, Esq. to The Honorable Eugene D. Serpentelli, A.J.S.C. dated November 24, 1987 (a copy of which is attached hereto). Mr. Norman advises that Old Bridge has submitted a housing element and fair share plan to COAH and expects certification before the end of this year. On behalf of Woodhaven Village, Inc. we hereby object to the granting of substantive certification to Old Bridge.

Woodhaven owns some 1455 acres in the Township of Old Bridge which acreage represents approximately 12.5% of the Township's land mass. Woodhaven instituted Mount Laurel litigation against the Township (et al.) on May 31, 1984. After eighteen months of settlement negotiations the parties entered a comprehensive settlement (Order & Judgment of Repose, entered by Hon. Eugene D. Serpentelli, A.J.S.C. on January 24, 1986). On October 6, 1987, The Hon. Eugene D. Serpentelli, A.J.S.C. entered an Order vacating the aforesaid Order and Judgment of Repose and transferring the Old Bridge Township Mount Laurel matter to COAH. Woodhaven has filed a Motion for Reconsideration which is pending before Judge Serpentelli. Accordingly, the ultimate outcome of the settlement is yet unknown.

As a result of the Mount Laurel action by Woodhaven pending for the past three and one-half years Old Bridge knew and knows of Woodhaven's significant interest in the Township's Mount Laurel compliance.

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As the foregoing reveals, Woodhaven is clearly an interested party with regard to the Township's Mount Laurel compliance package. However, to date Woodhaven has not been provided with copies of either the draft or final Housing Element and Fair Share Plan.

Accordingly, we request that Woodhaven be provided with copies of each and every document submitted to COAH, that Woodhaven be copied on all future correspondence and that the Township not be granted substantive certification until s.uch time as (1) the Court acts on the Motion for Reconsideration which will result in either transfer being made by the Court to COAH or not to COAH with regard to Woodhaven and (2) until such time as Woodhaven has had an opportunity to review and analyze the Township's proposal.
