

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2 MR. SIROTA: Mr. Bisgaier, my name is 3 Fredric Sirota. I'm an attorney and a member 4 of the firm of Wiley, Malehorn & Sirota and I 5 represent the Township of Rockaway and this is 6 a response, I take it, from our request for 7 production of documents. Are you representing 8 all the plaintiffs in this matter? 9 MR. BISGAIER: Yes. MR. SIROTA: As attorney or as agent for 10 11 producing documents? 12 MR. BISGAIER: As attorney and their 13 agent for producing their documents as their 14 attorney. MR. SIROTA: Have you showed the request 15 16 for production of documents to parties repre-17 senting each of the plaintiffs? MR. BISGAIER: I'm not sure I understand 18 19 your question. I'm representing each of the plaintiffs. 20 MR. SIROTA: Have you shown copies of 21 the request for production of documents to any 22 of the officers or members of the Morris County 23 Fair Housing Council? 24 25 MR. BISGAIER: No.

MR. SIROTA: Did you have a conversation with them pursuant to which or any such person pursuant to which you requested documents?

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MR. BISGAIER: Yes.

MR. SIROTA: Did you convey to them each and every request made in the request for production of documents?

MR. BISGAIER: No. I conveyed to them the request made on pages 5 and 6 of the Notice to Produce, the request for production of documents relating to their by-laws, minutes, etc., information which will be peculiar to the Fair Housing Council and the Morris County Branch of the N.A.A.C.P. All the other documents referred to are documents which would be in the files of the Public Advocate's Office.

MR. SIROTA: Who did you speak to at the Morris County Fair Housing Council with respect to production of documents?

MR. BISGAIER: I spoke to, at the Fair Housing Council, it would have been Blaire McGinnis, and the N.A.A.C.P. would have been Paul Cooper.

MR. SIROTA: What position is Miss McGinnis with respect to the Fair Housing

2		MR. BISGAIER: She's the president of
3		the Board of Directors or the Chairman of the
4		Board of Directors. Mr. Cooper is a similar
5		title with the N.A.A.C.P.
6		MR. SIROTA: And Mr. Cooper is Chairman
7		of the Board of the Morris County Branch of the
8		N.A.A.C.P.?
9		MR. BISGAIER: I believe that's his
10		title. I'm not sure, but it's a similar
11		position to that.
12		MR. SIROTA: And you yourself have
13		reviewed the request for production of docu-
14		ments?
15		MR. BISGAIER: Yes.
16		MR. SIROTA: And have you produced all
17		the documents requested therein?
18		MR. BISGAIER: The only documents that
19	n andre K. Kange	I know of that we used at various times prior
20		to instituting the complaint and upon which we,
21		well, relied in the sense that we reviewed them
1 22		which are not here, would be the various reports
23		of the Department of Community Affairs. I'm
24		not sure if all of them are here relating to
25		the 1978 housing allocation report that they
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did. Those were previously produced for Mr. Ferguson at a motion. I just simply forgot to bring them. That would involve the 1978 report, 1976 report, four technical reports for the basis of that 1976 report, housing needs analysis.

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MR. SIROTA: Excuse me. Before you get to these, if you might refer to them when we get to the particular point in which they are relevant, I would appreciate it. Is that all right?

MR. BISGAIER: Well, let me just complete my statement because I have not accumulated documents in the order you have requested them. The other documents which I was told by one of our attorneys is that he has and forgot to include was a December, 1978 map, flood insurance map. I believe it's for the Township of Chester. They can be produced or a copy of it can be mailed to you.

MR. SIROTA: So is it fair to say in addition to the flood insurance map for Chester, you don't have today with you the reports of the Community Affairs which are mentioned in the complaint?

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MR. BISGAIER: Right. One of them has already been marked as an exhibit in Mr. Mallach's deposition by Mr. Bernstein, but in any event those documents are readily available.

MR. SIROTA: Request number 1 is for any document referred to in plaintiff's pleadings, but not annexed thereto or recited verbatim therein, including but not limited to the land use plans and ordinances of each of the defendant municipalities.

Do you have those?

MR. BISGAIER: I have not brought with me the land use plans that we have in our office of all the defendant municipalities, nor have I brought with me the master plans of those municipalities. I stated to you previously I would be glad to have anybody come to my office and take a look at what we have, but it was a major effort just to pull these two boxes of materials from all of our files.

MR. SIROTA: This is a major case. MR. BISGAIER: Let me finish, and to bring them here and I have with me, I'd say every document that we relied upon short of the actual master plans and ordinances of the

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individual towns.

MR. SIROTA: And the Department of Community Affairs documents and the flood insurance map for Chester? 7

MR. BISGAIER: Right.

MR. SIROTA: Okay. Do you have those documents or writings pursuant to which, and this is paraphrasing your complaint, the New Jersey Judicial, Legislative and Executive branches have allegedly reiterated the mandate upon municipalities to provide, by their land use regulations and plans, for their fair share of the regional housing needs and to remove those restrictions which allegedly effectively bar the provision of low and moderate income housing opportunities.

What documents did that statement refer? MR. BISGAIER: Well, to the best of my recollection, the easiest way to recall the judicial mandates we are referring to there or the documents we are referring to there would be the Mount Laurel opinion and the Madison Township opinion. I did not bring copies of those documents with me. The legislative document, if you want to call it such, that was

14		reasonable time.
15		The executive documents which you
16		referred to, I think there may be copies of
17		those here, although I'm not sure.
18		MR. SIROTA: Would you review your
19		documents and see whether you have them?

22		MR. SIROTA: Yes, sir.
23		MR. BISGAIER: They would be Executive
24		Order 35 and I believe it's Executive Order 46.
25		I don't know if they are here.

6		as to whether it's been rescinded or withdrawn.

8		copy of Executive Order No. 35.

12		mentioned that there were only two executive

11		Mr. Bisgaier, would it be helpful if you
12		had a little time to organize your files?
13		MR. BISGAIER: That's what I'm doing
14		right now.
15		MR. SIROTA: Do you have a projection of
16		how long this will take you?
17		MR. BISGAIER: Well, what I'm doing right
18		now is organizing them by department of govern-

25		is Robert Goldsmith and I'll continue the
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procedures for the production of documents.

MR. BISGAIER: We are looking for now Department of Environmental Protection documents?

MR. GOLDSMITH: Right.

Okay. The documents that MR. BISGAIER: I have with me that are documents which were prepared by or for some way under the auspicious under the Department of Environmental Protection for the State of New Jersey are the following; one is March, 1979 document. It's the draft of the Northeast New Jersey Water Quality Management Plan. Another is quite simply a document by the Bureau of Geology which is simply a list of available DEP maps and publications. Another is the Master Sewerage Plan for the Upper Raritan and Delaware Watersheds which is a joint project of the various boards of chosen freeholders of the three relevant counties, including Morris and the Department of Environmental Protection. It has an October, 1970 date on it. Another is a document from the Department which lists a status report of the various sewerage bans. It relates to the various counties, but the specific pages which have been brought here relate to Morris County.

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Another is the technical design report requirements published by the Department, July, 1972. The purposes of their evaluation of the sufficiency of sewerage treatment plant or applications for sewerage treatment plants. Another is titled Project Report Requirements, same Department and same date.

MISS NUSSBAUM: Would you repeat that, please.

MR. BISGAIER: Project Report Requirements. Sewerage treatment facilities and applications for them.

Off the record.

(There is a discussion off the record.) MR. BISGAIER: What I'm going to do is identify these documents by numbers which the Public Advocate's Office has placed on them for our own filing purposes and at a later time those numbers will be translated into official identification numbers. It would just be to save time.

The Northeast New Jersey Water Quality Management Plan document has a number 13 on it. The Bureau of Geology document has a number 110. The Master Sewerage Plan has number 114. The

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Sewerage Status Report has a number 101.

MISS MC DERMOTT: I have a question on that. What is the date on that status report?

MR. BISGAIER: The latest, the only way I would personally know that is by the face of the document itself. There is another attorney in our office dealing with environmental issues and produced these at my request. The latest date on here either for the lifting of a sewerage ban or the partial lifting of a sewerage ban or the imposition of a sewerage ban would be 12/27/78.

MR. GOLDSMITH: Would you check with your office when you have a chance at some point and let us know whether that is the final date of the document?

MR. BISGAIER: It's the only document that we have on this. You want to know if there are other documents or what the date was?

MR. GOLDSMITH: This is excerpted from a larger document, so what the date of the larger document is.

MR. BISGAIER: Can you write these down and tell me later what you want?

The Technical Design Report document has

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a number 102. The Project Report Requirements document has a number 103.

There are a series of documents which the number 104, which are the monthly reports submitted to DEP by the Rockaway Valley Spray Irrigation System and the utility being, according to the face of the document, the Rockaway Town Square Mall in Rockaway Township, County of Morris. The dates on these documents, they run from September through February of 1979. September of '78 through February of '79.

MR. GOLDSMITH: What was the relevant authority?

MR. BISGAIER: Again this is from the face of the document. It's the Rockaway Town Square Mall. This is all it says.

Next DEP document here has a number 107, Guidelines for the Design of Land Disposal Facilities Utilizing Spray Irrigation. Next has a number 106. This is a DEP document giving construction approval for the plant in Rockaway Township dated June 10, 1975.

MR. GOLDSMITH: That is for a plant in Rockaway Township?

MR. BISGAIER: Yes. Next is the 105

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document. 105 is a report on the operation and maintenance of this Rockaway Town Square Shopping Center utility. I believe that's all of the documents with me that could be related to the Department of Environmental Protection.

Now, there are several documents here which are from the Department of Transportation.

MISS MC DERMOTT: I have a question. These are reports that relate to Rockaway Township. Do you have any reports that relate to the individual towns, other materials on special projects in other towns?

MR. BISGAIER: Not to my knowledge. These are the only ones which were given to me and I asked for all of the documents which we had in our files. Now, that's not to say we are not receiving documents through discovery from the individual towns relating to the environmental issues, water, sewerage management, but I have documents that we did not receive through the discovery process which were separately obtained by us.

MISS MC DERMOTT: I see.

MR. BISGAIER: The following documents are the New Jersey Department of Transportation

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1		documents. One has the number 11 on it. It's
2		the 1975 Summary Report by the Department of
3		Transportation relating to the New Jersey State
4		Airport System Plan. Next there are four docu-
5		ments.
6		MISS NUSSBAUM: Is there a number on
7		that?
8		MR. BISGAIER: Number 11. Next there
9		are four documents all of which bear the number
10		14 and all of which embody the New Jersey State
11		Rail Plan. In chronological order, they are
12		dated December 9, 1975, August 1, 1976, February
13		15, 1978, and October 15, 1978.
14		MR. GOLDSMITH: Are you at all familiar
15		with those documents, Mr. Bisgaier?
16		MR. BISGAIER: Personally familiar? I
17		have looked at those documents at various times,
18		yes.
19		MR. GOLDSMITH: Do you know what the
2 0		general content is?
21		MR. BISGAIER: The general content is
22		the evaluation and analysis of the existing
23		rail facilities in the State and projections,
24		suggestions and plans for future rail.
25		MR. GOLDSMITH: Both commuter and freight?
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MR. BISGAIER: Yes, I believe so. Of course, it's for the entire State and includes the relevant part, Morris County.

Now, there are several documents here from the -- these following documents are from the New Jersey Department of Labor and Industry. Document number 3 is a per capita money income for New Jersey dated May 17, 1978. Document number 10 is an 1970 Annual Summary of Residential Construction authorized by building permits. Also under document 10 is the 1971 Summary. Another document bearing the same number is 1972 document. Another is 1973. Another is 1974. Another is 1975, another is 1976 and another is 1977.

Document number 9 is a copy of a computer printout, several pages relevant to Home Mortgage Disclosure.

MR. GOLDSMITH: Do you know whether that was provided pursuant to a request by the Public Advocate or was that from another document promulgated by the Department of Labor and Industry?

MR. BISGAIER: This is a labor and industry document and bears the number 9, and

12		I'm not sure whether we got it because we are
13		a public agency. It was just generally
14		requested by us and we received it. I don't
15		know that any member of the public can also
16		get a copy of it. I'm sure they could.
17		MR. GOLDSMITH: Thank you.
18	· · ·	MR. BISGAIER: Document number 8 would
19	an an an an an an an an an an an an an a	be the New Jersey Interim Population Projections,
20		1980 to the year 2000. That's dated June, 1978.
21		Document number 4 dated July 1, 1976, are the
22		official State Estimates for Population.
23		MR. GOLDSMITH: That's for the current
24		year, for the then current year 1976?
25		MR. BISGAIER: Yes. Also enumerated
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document number 3 are February, 1979 updates of the Per Capita Money Income for New Jersey.

MISS MC DERMOTT: Do you know where the source of the information is from?

MR. BISGAIER: Yes, these would be from the Department of Commerce. They are based on Federal information which is compiled by the State agencies for use in the State. Maybe it will save us time to say that the several documents indicated as number 3 are similar to the two already mentioned dealing with personal income and income data in New Jersey. They are essentially one updating the next to the most recent being the one previously mentioned, February of 1979.

For completeness sake, there are six documents that bear the number 3.

MR. SIROTA: Which are the documents that have already been marked or whatever you want to call it?

MR. BISGAIER: These. I was going to give you the Department of Community Affairs. MR. SIROTA: If I can just back up a wee bit. It's my understanding that just prior to lunch Mr. Goldsmith, with reference to

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paragraph 1 was asking you to produce documents promulgated by the executive branch and up to that point, up to lunch you had produced documents from the Department of Labor and Industry, Department of Transportation and the Department of Environmental Protection. Do those documents constitute all the documents that are subject to the Request to Produce from those agencies?

MR. BISGAIER: Yes.

MR. SIROTA: Are there ones you don't have with you today?

MR. BISGAIER: There are no **documents** that we gathered for purposes of this litigation which I do not have with me today other than that one Chester flood insurance map. As far as I can ascertain, I have found here all of the DCA reports that are referred to previously as not being present, so they are present.

One other set again are the specific land use ordinances and master plans that we purchased from the municipalities prior to instituting the litigation.

MR. SIROTA: In your use of the term we, does that mean that that answer relates to all the plaintiffs in this matter?

17		MR. BISGAIER: Well, if I made an error
18		in what I thought was necessary, I'll just
19		correct that at a later time. I think I have
20		with me everything that we have that you asked

23		MR. SIROTA: Sure. And does that mean,
24		sir, I can assume that, for example, the Fair
25		Housing Council has no reports or other docu-

SIROTA: You were going to get to the reports you have stemming from the Department of Community Affairs. MR. BISGAIER: Right. MR. SIROTA: If you are laying the out, you might want to lay out the Executive Orders which I think you had with you, 35 and 46. 35 is attached to 46, right? MR. BISGAIRE: Right. I'll give you our number and the title. Number 5 is the 1978 Housing Allocation Plan produced by the Division of State and Regional Planning of the Department of Community Affairs. 5A is the November, 1976 draft of that plan. 5B is a technical report for the plan entitled Present Housing Needs. 5C is the same thing entitled Prospective Housing Needs. 5D is the same thing entitled Fair Share

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Housing Allocation. 5E is the same thing entitled Housing Allocation Regions. 5F is a document which in another deposition has already been marked, entitled Analysis of Low Moderate Income Housing Need in New Jersey. **3G** is a document entitled the Housing Crisis in New Jersey, 1970. 7 is a document entitled State of New Jersey Housing Element prepared on the date of June 30, 1977. 7A is State Housing Programs and Policy, New Jersey's Housing Element. 6 is a January, 1978 document entitled New Jersey Directory of Subsidized Rental Housing. 4 is New Jersey Population Report, June, 4A, Land Use Regulation of Residential 72. Land Supply. 4B, New Jersey Municipal Profiles. 4C, New Jersey County and Municipal Worksheets. I believe those are all of the State agency documents that we have. MR. SIROTA: Mr. Bisgaier, I'm going to read to you --MR. BISGAIER: Excuse me for one second. The one other legislative document is a December

26, 1978 document marked number 12, Housing

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1		Needs and Opportunities in New Jersey. This
2		is a commission report for the New Jersey
3		General Assembly.
4		MR. SIROTA: Before we go any further,
5		did you produce today any documents relating
6		to mobile homes?
7		MR. BISGAIER: I don't believe there are
8		any here.
. 9		MR. SIROTA: Did you, in fact, rely upon
10		any documents relating to mobile homes, or to
11		your knowledge did your expert Mr. Hmeckel?
12		MR. BISGAIER: Mr. Haeckel has relied
13		on any number of documents. He prepared a
14		list of those and they were submitted to
15		defense counsel. As I understand from lunch,
16		he's been asked to produce certain documents
17		at his next deposition. We do not have any
18		here. We did not rely on any mobile home
19		documents as such in formulating our position
20		with regard to this particular case. We have,
21		of course, had the benefit of Mr. Haeckel's

24		MR. SIROTA: Do you possess any documents?
25		That is, when I say you, I mean all three of the

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plaintiffs relating to mobile homes.

Once again, the request relates to documents within your possession or control and not limited to that which you relied upon.

MR. BISGAIER: There may, in fact, be some documents in the office which I don't know about specifically which relate to mobile homes, all of which I'm sure are covered by Mr. Haeckel. I will ascertain if that's not true and produce at our next deposition any documents which we have which he is not otherwise going to be producing.

MR. SIROTA: Mr. Bisgaier, I'm going to read off to you a list of documents and ask you whether you produced them today. Also with respect to each one, I would like to know whether they are currently available so that any of the defendants may simply order them or obtain them. One is a preliminary statewide housing allocation plan.

MR. BISGAIER: That's been produced. MR. SIROTA: Is it currently available? MR. BISGAIER: Well, as a result of a motion by Mr. Ferguson I was curious as to that and called Jay Fiedler at the Department of

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1		Community Affairs who informed me that those
2		documents were available. I personally have
3-	NTENT	not asked for a copy since 1977. Other than

Many of these documents do not specifically relate to housing needs and relate to such matters as transportation plans and the like. So we can leave them aside for the moment.

MR. SIROTA: However, to be eventually included, we consider transportation as being relevant to this matter.

MR. BISGAIER: All right. Well, why don't I then give you a by agency all of what I

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have.

MR. SIROTA: That would be appreciated. MR. BISGAIER: Okay. These are documents which were prepared for the Board of Chosen Freeholders, as far as I can tell by the Morris County Planning Board. Document number 39 is the September, 1969 Initial Housing Element. Document number

31 is the Master Plan, Future Land Use Element. 50 is the Master Plan Supplemental Report on Sanitary Sewerage. 49 is the Master Plan on Sanitary Sewerage. 33 is the County Transportation Study and Interim Report. 34 is the Transportation Annual Report for 1976. 32 is entitled Morris County Government Structure and Services. 32A is entitled Highlights of Morris County Government, 1978.

MR. SIROTA: Population Housing, 1970 Census?

MR. BISGAIER: Yes, we would have commented on those applications possibly since the Community Development Applications themselves are well over 150 I think in New Jersey, but I can't tell you for sure which ones we have commented upon.

MR. SIROTA: Would you make a search and determine whether you commented upon the Morris

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County Application?

MR. BISGAIER: Sure.

MR. SIROTA: If you or any other State agency or Federal agency have commented upon the application and you have copies of those comments within your control or which are available to you, would you supply them?

MR. BISGAIER: I'll supply you with any such documents which we do have, yes.

MR. SIROTA: What documents constitute publication of review criteria by the Tri-State Regional Planning Commission which you allege are required of all locailities which receive Federal housing funds?

MR. BISGAIER: That again is part of the A-95 review process and I've already indicated those documents which we have from the Tri-State Regional Planning Commission, I believe.

MR. SIROTA: Do they constitute Tri-State's comments upon applications made by Morris County?

MR. BISGAIER: I believe so. You have document number 22. Maybe that document. I'll do another search and see if there is another one.

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MR. SIROTA: I'm keeping a running list of those items which you will make certain and I have a notation you will make a search for the A-95 comments upon Morris County, HUD Block Grant and we understand that will relate to comments made by any agency which you will have in your files or available to you or within your control.

MR. BISGAIER: Well, I'll certainly make copies for you of any of them we have in our possession available to us. Again, the Civil Rights Division may have made a comment. The Department of Environmental Protection may have. We may not have those comments. It would be as easy for you to get them as for us.

MR. SIROTA: Civil Rights Division. Do you mean the Division on Civil Rights?

MR. BISGAIER: Right.

MR. SIROTA: Which is not a part of the Public Advocate?

MR. BISGAIER: Right. I'll make available to you what I have. We may have comments that were made by other agencies and we may not, though.

MR. SIROTA: Which documents constitute,

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and this is paraphrasing or quoting the complaint, investigations and reports of the State of New Jersey allegedly documenting serious housing crisis throughout the state characterized by, among other facts, wide patterns of exclusionary land use regulations in the suburban areas outside of the urban centers.

MR. BISGAIER: Those would be the documents previously identified as formulating the basis for the ultimate 1978 Housing Allocation Plan.

MR. SIROTA: The DCA documents?

BISGAIER: Not other than what has 8 been produced, to my knowledge. 9 MR. SIROTA: Okay. MR. BISGAIER: We have no documents to produce in response to that request.

MR. SIROTA: Next paragraph is all correspondence to defendant municipalities by the plaintiffs with respect to the subject matter of the within litigation, whether sent or received prior or subsequent to the commencement of said litigation.

MR. BISGAIER: To my knowledge, other than correspondence from counsel, no such correspondence exists.

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MR. SIROTA: And was the Fair Housing Council and the N.A.A.C.P. advised of this demand?

MR. BISGAIER: They have been asked by me as to such matters and have not informed me there is any specific documentation such as is referred to in the demand. If you would like, what I'll do is check that again to make sure that it does not exist.

MR. SIROTA: With that same provision that I'll assume if I don't hear word in one week, that there are no such documents?

MR. BISGAIER: Right.

MR. SIROTA: All documents related to plaintiffs allegation that defendants action has precluded persons of low and moderate income from securing needed housing in the defendant municipalities and from sharing in their growth and development.

MR. BISGAIER: That is an allegation in the complaint which relates to ultimately expert opinion which has already been given in the form of expert reports and will be supplemented, if necessary.

MR. SIROTA: Any other documents with

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that allegation?

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2 MR. BISGAIER: Any other documents that would support that allegation would have already 3 been produced. I have nothing to add. MR. SIROTA: We are going to complete 18 this on a date agreed to by Mr. Bisgaier and 19 myself. 20 Mr. Bisgaier, I would like, for the 21 record, to read the list of documents. 22 MR. BISGAIER: Let me do that and if I 23 make a mistake, you can correct me. The status report of the sewerage bans. You want the date 24 25 of the report.

MR. SIROTA: A copy of the cover I think would do.

MR. BISGAIER: No, it won't. That was the problem. I'm supposed to ascertain to find the exact date when it was produced.

MR. SIROTA: I think you are also to find out if it was superceded.

MR. BISGAIER: I will check that, too. The Chester flood insurance map, New Jersey Statutes we believe may be relevant to housing production, any mobile home reports not to be produced by Mr. Haeckel which is in our possession, August, '74 housing work program submission by the Morris County Planning Board to the Department of Housing and Urban Development, first year's application to HUD for the Block Grant Program, A-95 review comments, Housing in New Jersey, 1968, Cahill messages, a blueprint for housing and a 1972 New Horizons in Housing.

MR. SIROTA: Including but not limited to those.

MR. BISGAIER: Right. By-laws and certificate of incorporation.

MR. SIROTA: I didn't write down the

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material with respect to the N.A.A.C.P., but you were going to check into whether that charter which you showed us was the charter of the local branch and whether by-laws of the N.A.A.C.P. --

MR. BISGAIER: There was some other things which I was to inform you about within a week or something like that.

MR. SIROTA: You advised that you spoke to the N.A.A.C.P. and the Fair Housing Council with respect to those requests contained or certain of the requests contained on pages 5 and 6. It was my concern that they may have additional documents relating to all the claims and you advised, unless I heard from you in writing to the contrary within one week, I can assume they have no other documents.

MR. BISGAIER: Let's make that two weeks to deal with mailing.

MR. SIROTA: I agree.

MR. BISGAIER: I'll let you know as soon as I find out.

MR. SIROTA: Mr. Bisgaier and I have agreed to adjourn this matter, that is, the production of documents to a date in the very

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near future which we will arrive at Wednesday.

MR. BISGAIER: Which is the 25th of April.

Off the record.

(There is a discussion off the record.)

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(May 9, 1979)

MR. SIROTA: Mr. Bisgaier, as you recall we have done the first nine requests and I understand that you brought with you some additional documents that you would like to mark in response to the first nine requests.

MR. BISGAIER: Right. Let's start from the top here. The first thing that we had left was the Status Report of Sewerage Bans. This was a document that's already been marked. A question arose as to the date of the document. I was able to glean from the document itself some of the final dates as indicated on that document and you or Bob was asking for the actual date of the document. I have not been able to ascertain that. We would have to find out from DEP.

> MR. SIROTA: Which document is that, sir? MR. BISGAIER: This is a status report

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on sewerage bans. It's obviously a constantly updated document. We got a document at some point which would reflect on its face as to when it was updated. It's very difficult to ascertain now exactly as of when that particular document was prepared. Those are constantly updated documents, but in any event we will try to find out from DEP either when that document was prepared or if we get a more updated one. we will have that substituted. The Chester flood insurance map I have with me. That is part of a package of other documents which I had with me last time and maybe can be marked now as one set, documents which involve various flood insurance maps and flood insurance reports and the like prepared by the Department of Housing and Urban Development. It's a Federal department. I have that here marked as 108.

MR. SIROTA: What specifically is that packet known as, 108? Does that include a flood map with respect to every municipality in this lawsuit? Perhaps you can read off the names.

MR. BISGAIER: Okay. This is Chester, Mendham and Boonton. These are all the townships.

21		MR. BISGAIER: Okay. The Housing Work
22		Program Submission by the Morris County Planning
23		Board I believe is contained in those documents.
24		They may have been already named prior to your
25		coming to the deposition last week. When we
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get a look at the final list from the Stenographer, I'll make sure that that is listed. We were not able to find it in our office, so the assumption is it must be in these documents. We will have to get a copy.

The first year's application to HUD from the Morris County Block Grant Development Office is not in our possession. We have not been able to find it. If we can, I will supply that.

I have a packet of A-95 comments that we were able to find. Some of them are from our office. One or two are from other effices. I'll clip those somehow. That packet has been already referred to, or has been marked number 202.

Now, gubernatorial messages that you mentioned last time which are referred to by us which the attorney who reviewed them and prepared that aspect of the complaint informs me those are not in our office and never were. She went to the State law library in Trenton and read them there and we do not have a copy of those documents.

The certificate of incorporation of the Morris County Fair Housing Council and two

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other documents prepared by them which may be deemed relevant to this case by someone, so I produced them, have been enumerated 203. MR. SIROTA: May I see those documents, please.

MR. BISGAIER: Sure. We have asked for but have not yet received the certificate of incorporation of the Morris County Branch of the N.A.A.C.P. and we will forward that upon receipt.

MR. SIROTA: With respect to 203, if can backtrack a little.

MR. BISGAIER: Sure.

MR. SIROTA: It appears to me that that number includes the certificate of incorporation of the Merris County Fair Housing Council, a Morris County Fair Housing Council Summary of Contacts made by type, March 24, 1978 through March 27, 1979. The second document with the same heading is the foregoing, though a different document, and a document captioned Morris County Fair Housing Council CD Housing Council. With respect to the last document, Mr. Bisgaier, this document provides percentages by municipality of contacts made. Is this intended to

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refer to the fact that the contacts presently reside in the community or that the persons contacted wish to reside in the relevant communities?

MR. BISGAIER: My assumption, I'm sure it's accurate that those are contacts from people living in the communities referred to.

MR. SIROTA: I note there is another document attached to 203 and that's the Morris County Fair Housing Council sources of income sheet.

MR. BISGAIER: 204 is a document produced by the National Committee Against Discrimination in Housing entitled Jobs and Housing.

MR. SIROTA: That's dated March, 1972? MR. BISGAIER: Right. 205 is a document entitled a Survey of Social and Economic Conditions in Morris County as they Affect the Negro, August through September, 1956, prepared by the Morris County Community Chest and Council and the Mørris County Urban League.

MR. SIROTA: Paul Cooper was the Executive Director at the time?

MR. BISGAIER: Yes. Document 109 is a copy of a petition that was filed before the

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1 United States Environmental Protection Agency 2 in the matter of the petition of the City of 3 East Orange, New Jersey and the Passaic River 4 Coalition. The petition itself is an eight 5 page document dated 12/19/78 with a nine page 6 addendum which is attached to it. 7 MR. SIROTA: What does that relate to, 8 109, generally? 9 MR. BISGAIER: Again, this is something 10 that Keith Osdorf will be able to tell you in 11 greater detail. In order for me to answer that, 12 I would have to read it. 13 MR. SIROTA: I wouldn't want to put you 14 through that. 15 MR. BISGAIER: Okay. 111 is entitled 16 Facilities Plan, Final Report for the Washington 17 Township MUA as the lead agency in the Townships 18 of Mount Olive and Roxbury prepared by Lan 19 Associates, Incorporated, Hawthorne, New Jersey, 20 dated August 1, 1978. There is no way to ascertain how many pages. 22 Approximately two inches? MR. SIROTA: 23 MR. BISGAIER: Approximately two inches. 24 MR. SIROTA: That's 109 and you went to

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MR. BISGAIER: 110 I believe has already been marked. 112 is the Pequannock Watershed Conservation and Development Plan called Municipal Impact. This is the only part of the document we have here, which is for Jefferson Township, which are pages 32 through 38. Either we do not have the rest of the document -- we do not have the rest of the document and I don't know where you can obtain a copy of the rest of it if you want.

Document 113 contains a compilation of correspondence to or from the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and is bound by a rubber band. It has approximately 79 pages and essentially relating to various sewerage treatment plans or facilities in townships located in Morris County.

MR. SIROTA: I note Mendham Borough is mentioned and there is also an application for a conceptual approval for waster water disposal system for proposed attached single family development on Old Chester Gladstone Road in Chester Township.

MR. BISGAIER: That I believe includes all of the documents which we have produced.

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If the Court Reporter should find some in going through this that we have not, we will go back on the record.

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MR. SIROTA: By this you are referring to several boxes that you brought with you today?

MR. BISGAIER: Right. Now, there were at various times, I indicated that we couldn't find documents or the like throughout this deposition, I guess this is. Once I receive the deposition we will go through it again and make another attempt to ascertain if we have in our possession any other documents that either were not named or I could not find and I'll inform you of that as soon as that's done, which should be relatively soon after we receive the transcript.

MR. SIROTA: That would be in the form of a letter to me advising as to whether, in fact, the production has been complete?

MR. BISGAIER: Right.

MR. SIROTA: And presumably if it's not complete, what documents are lacking, when and how, you will supply them?

MR. BISGAIER: Right. Off the record.

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(There is a discussion off the record.) MR. BISGAIER: What we are going to do is mark as the first exhibit when this is officially marked by the Stenographer, the actual Notice to Produce Documents and then references will be made to that by the numerical paragraph listing.

MR. SIROTA: In our former attempt to produce documents we reached request number 9. By including the Notice to Produce, rather than read the rest commencing with 10, 1'11 simply refer to 10 and ask Mr. Bisgaier what he has produced with respect to that specific number.

(Request to Produce is received and marked P-1 for Identification.)

MR. SIROTA: All my questions relate to P-1. The numbers relate to the numbers in P-1.

With respect to number 10, what documents have you produced?

MR. BISGAIER: Okay. I don't recall if we got into this in the last day or not, so let me just respond to that to some extent by saying I don't know specifically which of

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these documents, at the time we were evaluating the preparation of the complaint, were relied upon at any given time for the specific allegations contained in the complaint. The way the attorneys went about preparing the complaint was to initially gather most of the information that is contained in the answer to this question for the production of documents. They were read by various attorneys. The environmental documents were read by environmental attorneys and the like, and from that certain knowledge was gleaned and a certain position was taken regarding the various municipalities that were sued, The complaint then was prepared without specific regard to the documents referred to in the sense that it was not prepared as a brief might be prepared with legal citations and the major documents that were relied upon were then referred to in, I believe two or three paragraphs of the complaint. I'm not sure, but I believe it's 17, 19 and 20. In any event, it would be easy to glean that from the face of the complaint.

As to documents, as to how these documents will eventually be used by the plaintiffs,

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again I cannot say that for a certainty. The various plaintiffs experts may or may not be relying on these documents and that can be ascertained or has already been ascertained I believe in the course of discovery. We have, as attorneys, have not made a decision at this time as to which, if any, of these documents that we would attempt to have introduced into evidence at the time of the trial. I think I mentioned the last time as soon as those determinations are made, we will inform the defendants of all exhibits that we intend to have introduced, as we expect the defendants to inform us as to all exhibits they intend to introduce. Other than to say these are documents that we have in our files which were gathered by us in preparation for the complaint, most of which were gathered for the preparation of the complaint, some postdate the complaint and which were relied upon for the development of the general and specific knowledge in the office regarding Morris County and the specific municipalities, it would be actually impossible to be able to say for any specific allegation which particular document was relied upon simply

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because that's not how the complaint was prepared. It would be possible I suppose to go through all the documents and glean from them which relate to specific allegations which could be said to contain facts which support specific allegations. The plaintiffs have not done that. Their attorneys have not done that and that statement would essentially hold for all of the remaining items in P-1 and if I have not said so before, it would probably hold for some of the prior items that we have already discussed.

MR. SIROTA: Are there any documents other than the ones you have produced today which relate to the alleged misuse of the delegated municipal authority by the municipalities in their upper class, predominantly white community?

MR. BISGAIER: The only other documents, and those which have been produced here which we have in our files or had in our files, since some of them have now been updated by Answers to Interrogatories, were the zoning ordinances which were then in existence or then in effect for all of the townships, at least in the sense

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that they were the documents which were sent to the Public Advocate's Office at our request of the relevantmunicipal clerks. Other than those documents, the only other things that were reviewed, to the best of my recollection at this time prior to filing the complaint, were several other documents over at the Department of Environmental Protection which were read by an attorney in our office who, and I believe those included some of the preliminary work that was being done on the 201 and 208 planning and analysis that's being done by DEP for Morris County.

MR. SIROTA: What is 201 and 208?

MR. BISGAIER: Those are Federal programs which are in effect resulting in major water sewerage facilities analysis in the State of New Jersey for various reasons in the State. The Morris County planning is being done by the Department of Environmental Protection. Some other counties, the county is doing the planning or relevant local authority is doing the planning, but for Morris County, DEP is doing it. That document, the publication of the document I believe is supposed to be eminent.

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Other than that, review was made of documents in the possession of the Morris County Planning Board by myself on two different occasions which mostly included various master plans and zoning ordinances on file with the County and I believe it was 1976 or 1977 aerials of the County which were reviewed by an attorney in the office, but I cannot tell you specifically whether it was all of the aerials for the entire County or just certain specific locations in the County. In any event, those are the aerials which are in the possession of the Morris County Planning Board and which are at their office. We do not have them. I think that would be the totality of what was done prior to the filing of the complaint.

MR. SIROTA: Was that your answer to number 11?

MR. BISGAIER: Yes.

MR. SIROTA: With respect to number 12, what specific documents --

MR. BISGAIER: I would have the same answer to number 12.

To give you an example, number 12 talks about plaintiffs allegations that Morris County is a ring County of the New York Metropolitan

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My own recollection is that virtually area. all of the documents which we produced from the Tri-State Regional Planning Commission, the Regional Plan Association, many of the documents produced from the Morris County Planning Board such as the future land use element adnauseam refer to the metropolitan region including Morris County as part of that region radiating out of New York City and refers to the specific rings around the region. Most if not all of the master plans that we have reviewed likewise at one point or another refer to that region and to the growth pattern out of the region into Morris County as the major stimulating factor, if not the only stimulating factor for development which is taking place in the County in the last decade or two, but as to which specifically we used to formulate that conclusion. I would be unable -- first of all. I don't recollect.

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MR. SIROTA: I'm not only asking what documents you actually used to formulate that conclusion, but which documents relate to this claim in fact.

MR. BISGAIER: Well, in fact I have not

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reviewed them for the most part since filing the complaint in order to catalog them as you listed the request for production of documents. I would only do that if I was intending to introduce them into evidence or use them for evidenciary purposes at the time of trial and I'm not at the point of making that kind of determination.

MR. SIROTA: Just to reiterate, at the last day which we produced documents, you advised that you were the agent for all three plaintiffs?

MR. BISGAIER: Yes.

MR. SIROTA: Even though you are also the attorney, you are the agent for producing these documents?

> MR. BISGAIER: Yes, that's right. MR. SIROTA: With respect to 13? MR. BISGAIER: I would have the same

answer.

MR. SIROTA: With respect to 14? MR. BISGAIER: Same answer.

MR. SIROTA: And again with respect to each of these numbers, when you say you have the same answer, I assume that means there are
