Dear Ms. Dribnack:

Pursuant to my telephone conversation with your office of even date herewith, I am enclosing a list of proposed corrections to the transcript which was prepared by your office in connection with the above-entitled matter. The list is submitted with the approval of our office, Mason, Griffin & Pierson, Esqs., McCarter & English, Esqs., and Gary Gordon, Esq., of the American Civil Liberties Union.

We do not mean the enclosed list to be an exhaustive analysis of all typographical and other errors in the transcript. We have focused our attention upon the portion of the transcript which sets forth the court's opinion which is obviously the most significant portion of the transcript. As to the corrections which are not merely typographical, but which call for a change as to the language used, the attorneys who were present in court have attempted to reconstruct the court's remarks based upon their memory of the court's remarks and the common sense meaning of what was said in the particular context in which the court's remarks were made.
