

# Hill dev. Co. letter to Judge re KHOV data in East Brunswick

Dear Judge Serpentelli:

Please refer to David Frizell's letter to you of April 10, 1985 enclosing information from the Hovnanian Company on 25 lower income households occupying <u>Mount Laurel</u> housing in East Brunswick and comparing that data with the lower income residents of "The Hills". Although The Hills has not completed the analysis of their data, I am of the opinion, as is, I believe, Alan Mallach, that the characterization of the lower income population as "yuppies" is incorrect and misleading and comes from newspaper reporters who have not had access to the data.

The Hills Development Company, as of April 16, 1985, has entered into 210 contracts with <u>Mount Laurel</u> home buyers, substantially more than the 25 home buyers listed by Hovnanian Company. A copy of a computer print out showing the occupation of each of those home buyers, their age and martial status is enclosed. I hope you will agree with me that the overwhelming majority of the occupations listed are not characteristic of the "upscale professionals", known as "yuppies". Further, I am informed by Tom Hall that the Newsweek definition of "yuppies" are single, age 35 or under, making over \$35,000; so that by income alone, none of The Hills home buyers meet the Newsweek definition.

As you know, Bedminster is on the "outer fringes" of the greater New York metropolitan area. Sources of local employment in the Bedminster area are generally "high tech", service oriented companies or small establishments providing for local needs. Until the construction of I-287 and I-78, limited access to the industrialized areas to the east of Bedminster delayed development and contributed to the area's noticeable absence of traditional industrial uses which are often more likely to be associated with "blue collar" employment.

However, the area is not without its share of lower income employment. As the enclosed information indicates, many of those under contract at Village Green have occupations which can be regarded as at the lower end of the "white collar" employment spectrum. The overwhelming majority of these jobs are also

not of a type in which one would expect to find substantial opportunities for career advancement. In fact, a substantial number of the prospective heads of household hold clerical or secretarial jobs. Such jobs often provide even less opportunity for economic advancement than those found in traditional "blue collar" employment.

Although the enclosed information may not reflect job categories which many may have envisioned as characteristic of the State's low and moderate income population, I'm sure you will agree that the job categories represented certainly dispel the suggestion that <u>Mount Laurel</u> housing will be populated by upwardly mobile "yuppies". Rather, as this data demonstrates, it is most likely to be occupied by those holding jobs which are characteristic of the lower end of the job market in which such housing is located.

When The Hills Development Company has completed its computer sorts and is in a position to give better demographic data, I will forward it to you for your information. Since this information does not bear directly on any of the cases before Your Honor, and may be of interest to the other judges involved with <u>Mount Laurel</u>, I am taking the liberty of sending a copy of this letter, together with David Frizell's letter to you of April 10, 1985, to Judges Gibson and Skillman for their information.

The Middlesex County version appears to be more blue collar than professional in orientation, although it is precominantly young couples with children.
