CERTIFICATION OF BERTRAM E. BUSCH, ESQ. IN OPPOSITION TO MOTION FOR ATTORNEYS'S FEES AND COST

My name is Bertram E. Busch and I hereby certify as follows:

1. I am the Township Attorney for the Township of
East Brunswick and have been since 1974. East Brunswick was
names as a Defendant in the above captioned matter and actively
participated in the litigation through its various stages up
to and including the remand to Judge Serpentelli. I personally
am familiar with the negotiations which took place with
representatives of the Plaintiff which had sued East Brunswick.

Specifically, I negotiated a settlement with Janet La Bella, Esq. and Bruce Gelber, Esq. John Payne also became involved in later discussions as did Eric Neisser.

This certification is submitted in opposition to the Plaintiff's application for expert fees, attorneys fees and costs as they relate to the Township of East Brunswick.

On March 23, 1984, I submitted a Notice of Motion to Judge Serpentelli with copy to all attorneys in the case, to approve a Consent Order between the Plaintiffs and the Township of East Brunswick. A copy of my letters of March 23, to Judge Serpentelli and Janet La Bella are annexed hereto.

- 2. Ms. La Bella responded by letter of March 26, 1984 sending me a "slightly revised draft of the Consent Order." Rather than burdening the Court with all the different drafts, I can simply state that none of the drafts either prepared by me or prepared by the Plaintiffs or anyone else ever contained a requirement that the Township of East Brunswick would have to pay for the Plaintiff's legal fees or costs.
- 3. On March 26, 1984, I was advised that our Motion to Approve a Settlement was adjourned until April 9, 1984. In the meantime we continued to negotiate with representatives of the Plaintiffs over such things as mandatory set aside ordinances, credit for 29 units to be built by Hovnanian and the availability for low and moderate income housing on 98 acres owned by the Diocese of Metuchen. At no time was there any

discussion about paying legal fees or costs. If in fact the Township had been asked to assume such costs, that may very well have adversely affected the Township's willingness to settle.

On or about April 6, 1984, I received the Fair Share Report submitted by Carla Lerman. That report had little bearing on the negotiations in April 1984 with regard to the 98 acres owned by the Diocese of Metuchen and the contingent zone on Dunhams Corner Road.

On April 16, 1984, East Brunswick put its entire settlement on the record in open Court before Judge Serpentelli. On April 25, 1984, I received Janet La Bella's draft Order together with ordinances which would be incorporated within it. Throughout the rest of April 1984 and May 1984 draft of ordinances were forwarded back and forth between our office and the offices of Janet La Bella and John Payne. The final hang-up had to do with the language in the mobile home ordinance. I received a memorandum from Carla Lerman dated May 12, 1984 indicating that East Brunswick owed the sum of \$1,572.00 for her services through March 31, 1984. A copy of that correspondence is annexed hereto. I sent a voucher to Ms. Lerman on May 21, 1984, a copy of which correspondence is attached.

4. By letter dated May 31, 1984, a copy of which is attached, Janet La Bella sent me a signed Consent Order subject to the comments of her letter.

- 5. On July 9, 1984, I sent Bruce Gelber revisions to certain schedules following a conference call which both of us had with Judge Serpentelli. A copy of that letter is also annexed. Judge Serpentelli signed the Consent Order on July 12, 1984.
- 6. On September 9, 1984, Ms. Lerman sent a letter to me complimenting the work done by the Township of East Brunswick in settling the litigation. She also sent her bill in the amount of \$280.00. Attached is copy of her letter of September 9, 1984, the voucher for \$280.00 which I sent back to her and which resulted in a payment to her and my letter of September 12 responding.
- 7. East Brunswick was the first municipality in this litigation to settle its case after the remand to Judge Serpentelli. The settlement resulted in a Consent Order and Final Judgment. The Township of East Brunswick, after subjecting itself to tremendous criticism, adopted ordinances to implement the settlement and in fact affordable housing has been built along with other high density development at a record rate. If East Brunswick is required to pay anything else above that which was stipulated to in the Consent Order, East Brunswick reserves its right to move to reopen the entire judgment and to either set aside the Consent Order or to

move to transfer to the Affordable Housing Council. East Brunswick also reserves the right to move for costs in connection with this motion.

I hereby certify that the foregoing statements made by me are true. I am aware that if any of the foregoing statements made by me are willfully false, I may be subject to punishment.

Pursuant to our phone conversation of May 30, 1984, I am enclosing a signed original and one copy of the East Brunswick and Urban League Consent Order, which you have agreed to hold in escrow until the revisions set forth below have been made to the specified ordinances. understand that you will then forward a revised set of ordinances to Judge Serpentelli and Carla Lerman.

Mobile - Manufactured and Modular -

Manufactured Housing Ordinance

Section 2.B.

The definition of municipal service fee should specify that it applies only to mobile home parks.

Section 9.C.3.

The word "lot" should be changed to "yard".

Section 9.D.1.

The minimum proximity limits of 20 and 25 feet are inconsistent with the side yard requirements contained in

Section 9.C.2. and should be changed to 15 and 17 feet

respectively.

✓ Section 9.D.4.

The requirement that sheds and accessory storage structures be located a minimum of five (5) feet from the mobile home unit is unnecessary, potentially cost producing and restricts flexibility of yard design. This requirement

should be eliminated.

Section 10.

A sentence should be added stating that the Township shall accept the dedication of streets and roads located in mobile and manufactured home

subdivisions.

Section 13.E.1.

√ A maximum size of 40 square

feet is sufficient for identification

signs.

Section 13.F.

These sections should only apply to mobile home parks.

Affordable Housing Ordinance

Section D.1.(b). This phrase should be changed

to read: determining the maximum resale prices and rental charges of the Low and Moderately Priced Dwelling Units to assure that the units remain affordable to Families of Low or Moderate Income.
