

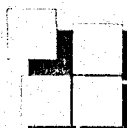

Dear Judge Serpentelli:

I want to support Richard Coppola's conclusion in his letter to you of May 10th. I think the proper approach when it is impossible to determine whether a county is to be included or excluded from a specific region is to average the findings. The method has a sound and logical planning basis; specifically, it indicates that the disputed county has some impact (whether positive or negative) but, because of its location, that impact is not as severe as if it were clearly within the region. The averaging approach assigns a value of one-half which accurately reflects the probable impact of the disputed county on the overall findings.

For this reason, I concur in Mr. Coppola's approach.
